## PENSACOLA TO WELCOME & COMMISSION THE USS RICHARD M. MCCOOL, JR. (LPD 29)



The Greater Pensacola Area Commissioning Committee proudly welcomes the USS Richard M. McCool, Jr. (LPD 29) to Naval Air Station Pensacola (NASP). The ship will offer free public tours from September 2nd-4th, from 1 p.m. – 4 p.m., and the U. S. Navy will commission the ship on September 7th, 2024, at NASP Pier at 10 a.m.

The USS Richard M. McCool, Jr., an amphibious transport dock, is named in honor of U.S. Navy Captain Richard M. McCool, Jr., who was awarded the Medal of Honor in 1945 for the heroism he displayed after his ship was attacked by kamikaze aircraft in the Battle of Okinawa. This will be the Navy's 13th San Antonio-class amphibious transport dock ship.

Amphibious transport docks are used to transport and land Marines, their equipment, and supplies by using two embarked Ship to Shore Connector Crafts called Landing Craft Air Cushions (LCACs) – often referred to as hovercrafts, or other support vehicles augmented by helicopters or vertical take-off and landing aircraft (MV22). These ships support amphibious assault, special operations, or expeditionary warfare missions and serve as secondary aviation platforms for amphibious operations.

Please note, the schedule of events listed below may change pending weather and other conditions:

Free Public Ship Tours at NASP Pier on Monday, September 2nd - Wednesday, September 4th – 1p.m. – 4p.m.

**USS McCool Commissioning Ceremony at NASP Pier** on Saturday, September 7th at 10a.m. *The public is encouraged to bring lawn chairs.* 

Details for signing up for ship tours will be announced once security and logistics details are finalized. The base remains at the current security level. Visitors should expect security checks prior to tours and must be able to climb stairs. Closed toe shoes with slacks are encouraged. Backpacks and strollers will not be permitted on the ship. No animals will be allowed on the ship. There are no public restrooms aboard the ship. To learn more about the USS Richard M. ## MEET THE BOSS LUNCHEON MAY 23, 2024

On May 23 we hosted our second Admiral's Club luncheon of the year where members heard directly from guest speaker CAPT Jeffrey Baker, USN, Commanding Officer, Precommissioning Unit Richard M. McCool. Captain Baker is a seasoned leader in the U.S. Navy with a career marked by distinguished service and strategic expertise. He joined the Navy in 1994 after graduating from Westminster College with a B.S. in Physics, later specializing in nuclear propulsion and becoming an instructor at NPTU Ballston Spa, NY. Commissioned through Officer Candidate School in 1998, Captain Baker pursued advanced studies and completed Joint Professional Military Education at the Naval War College and National Defense University. His operational roles include Main Propulsion Officer on USS Shreveport (LPD 12), Chief Engineer on USS Gunston Hall (LSD 44), and Commanding Officer on USS Tortuga (LSD 46). He has also served in key shore assignments, including as a Federal Executive Fellow in Washington D.C. and Commanding Officer for USS Richard M. McCool (LPD 29), Captain Baker's leadership has been recognized with decorations such as the Legion of Merit and multiple Meritorious Service and Navy Commendation Medals, reflecting his exemplary contributions to naval operations and strategy.

The event was emceed by our very own RADM Don Quinn, USN (Ret). During the event guests were able to learn about CAPT Baker's service history, the 400 person crew that will be running the new ship, and information on the upcoming commissioning. #### APRIL 24, 2024 - USCG DAUNTLESS IS WELCOMED HOME AFTER DEPLOYMENT


After a 61-day patrol in the Windward Passage and Florida Straits, the DAUNTLESS arrived back at NAS Pensacola. During their deployment, crew members carried out vital maritime safety and security operations, focusing on safeguarding lives at sea and preventing illegal migrant voyages heading towards the United States.

#### APRIL 27, 2024 - USCG DILIGENCE IS WELCOMED HOME FROM THE YARD

After patrol, the cutter was undergoing repairs in the Coast Guard Yard, in Baltimore Maryland. They happened to be in port during the Francis Scott Key Bridge collapse. In the early hours after the disaster, Diligence's small boat crews conducted search and rescue operations for missing persons and later provided a persistent presence to enforce a safety zone during salvage efforts. They were stuck for several weeks in Baltimore after the bridge collapse so it was an extra special welcome home when they made it back to Pensacola.

**JUNE 21, 2024 - USCG CUTTER DAUNTLESS CELEBRATES 56 YEARS OF SERVICE** Selected for layup status due to Coast Guard personnel challenges, the DAUNTLESS served the country for over 56 years. The Heritage Celebration ceremony was presided over by VADM Nathan Moore, USCG Atlantic Area Commander, and served to celebrate Dauntless' contributions to the service and nation in the presence of cutter leadership, current and former crew members, families, friends and members of our Pensacola Navy League Council. The ship has sailed for the Coast Guard Yard in Baltimore, MD awaiting further disposition instructions and the crew was reassigned to various billets across the Coast Guard.

#### JUNE 22, 2024 - USCG RELIANCE IS WELCOMED HOME AFTER PATROL

On Thursday, June 20th, the Coast Guard Cutter RELIANCE turned 60! RELIANCE launched out of Galveston, TX in 1964 and immediately began testing the prototype flight deck capability. RELIANCE is the oldest, active commissioned warship and oldest flight deck capable ship in the U.S. arsenal. Only the USS CONSTITUTION ("Old Ironsides" is a 3-masted wooden-hulled U.S. Navy heavy Frigate launched 1797) and USS PUEBLO (U.S. Navy warship captured by North Korea in 1968 and still moored in Pyongyang North Korea) are older commissioned warships.

As for the rest of the patrol, the ship sailed the Caribbean for a counterdrug mission and a highly visible operation with partners from Colombia and the Dominican Republic. An unexpected Key West visit to repair an equipment casualty and an unfortunate issue with the helicopter impacted the patrol's results. RELIANCE did visit Curacao, Netherlands Antilles. For two days, the crew explored the Caribbean island and marveled at its vibrant Dutch architecture to repair an equipment casualty. The crew enjoyed that trip and the return to homeport!
