## Military Recognition Day Returns

The annual Margaret Flowers Civic Award Military Recognition Day (MRD) ceremony resumes after a two year hiatus due to COVID restrictions. The largest and most anticipated event of the Pensacola Navy League, MRD honors military members who have demonstrated significant community service. Honorees are nominated by their commands. Selection criteria is based on civic work in the community, leadership, rate proficiency and representation of appearance. Each nominee is recognized ceremoniously with one outstanding military community service leader selected for the prestigious Margaret Flowers Civic Award. Margaret Flowers was a retired civil service employee who left a legacy of service to both the U.S. Navy and the community.

This event will be held February 16<sup>th</sup> at 11:30am at the Pensacola Bay Center. Guest speaker is RADM Kyle Cozad, USN (Ret). RADM Cozad is the President of the National Naval Aviation Museum Foundation. Cozad, a native of Las Vegas, graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1985 with a Bachelor of Science in Oceanography and Physics. He earned a Master of Science in National Resource Management, graduating with distinction, from the National Defense University's Eisenhower School. He also attended the Navy Corporate Business Course at the University of Virginia's Darden School of Business. His operational Maritime Patrol and Reconnaissance Aircraft (MPRA) tours span all four MPR sites in Brunswick, Maine, Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii, Whidbey Island, Washington and Jacksonville, Florida. Cozad has served extensively as an instructor pilot in multiple operational tours and completed two tours with VP-30, the P-3 Fleet Replacement Squadron and one with the Canadian Air Force's 404 Squadron in Greenwood, Nova Scotia, as a CP-140 exchange in-





Master of Ceremonies, CAPT J. Michael Denkler, USN (Ret) welcomed everyone including our local POW's. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by POW, CAPT Fred "Bill" Franke, Jr., USN (Ret). Chorister, Bonnie Buck, led the group in "God Bless America." CDR Mark Schmitt, USN (Ret) shared the Table of Remembrance, followed by "Tapps" played by bugler, Scotty Mills.



Guest speaker was Hill Goodman, Historian of the National Naval Aviation Museum. ## NAVY LEAGUE GROUP TOURS THE PORT OF PENSACOLA

C everal NL members enjoyed an Open House field Trip at the Port of Pensacola that included a lunch, followed by a tour of all of the Port's facilities.

The Port of Pensacola was "adopted" by the Pensacola Navy League during a ceremony held during the Open House.

Port Director Clark Merritt was also presented with the Bronze Sponsor recognition certificate for the Port of Pensacola's sponsorship of the Pensacola Navy League.



From Commander Ryan P. Devlin, USCG CGC DAUNTLESS to CAPT Matthew Meilstrup, USCG (Ret):

I wanted to give you an update of some recent accomplishments of our DAUNTLESS shipmates.

On December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022, BM2 Kalie Jones was meritoriously advanced to BM1 by VADM Lunday at the Brooklyn Navy Yard (GMD). VADM Lunday, CMC DeMello, the LANTAREA Chaplain, and several others made a special trip to Brooklyn to advance BM1 Jones while the ship is in dry-dock.

Additionally, VADM Lunday informed the crew that DAUNTLESS was selected as the 2022 Hopley Yeaton Cutter Excellence Award winner for Medium Endurance Cutters, with DILIGENCE coming in close behind. Of note, BMC Llamas, my Command Chief, was nominated for the Superior Cutterman Award.

In 2022, during the Operation VIGILANT SENTRY phase elevation, USCGC DAUNTLESS interdicted 18 unseaworthy migrant vessels and held, processed, and repatriated 975 Cuban and Haitian migrants over 67 days in the Florida Straits and Windward Passage. USCGC DAUNTLESS upheld WMEC migrant holding standards despite operating short-staffed. USCGC DAUNTLESS was the first post-COVID-19 cutter to complete the full three-week TSTA, earning a 98% average drill score across 109 training evolutions and the Atlantic Area Overall Operational Readiness Award. During Operation UNIFIED RESOLVE, USCGC DAUNTLESS safely conducted a challenging and heroic rescue of 27 migrants from Monito Island in heavy surf conditions.

The winners will be recognized at the 2023 Surface Navy Association (SNA) National Symposium, which will be held in Washington, DC from January 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

## JOIN THE PENACOLA NAVY LEAGUE

We welcome everyone to join our Pensacola Navy League and participate in our Council Events. Many of our activities offer both member and non-member prices. The non-member price option is for those not yet ready to join, but interested to see what the Navy League is all about. Additionally, Membership in the Pensacola Navy League offers perks to our members as a function of their level of membership. Examples of such perks include; invitations to free events, discounted tickets to special events, recognition, and more. In order to join and participate in the local Pensacola Navy League, membership with the National Navy League is a prerequisite. The categories of membership in the Pensacola Navy League are:

**Regular Member** – Any citizen of the United States desiring to support and advance the objective and purpose of the Navy League shall be eligible as a Regular Member. Active Duty members of any branch of the armed service persons are not eligible for membership while on active duty. Reservists are eligible for membership, but while on active duty are not eligible to vote or hold a Navy League office.

**Honorary Member** – Any outstanding person who has shown and expressed unusual interest in this Council and who has made significant accomplishments at local, regional, or national level of the Navy League shall be eligible for Honorary Membership upon unanimous approval of Council Members present at a regular monthly meeting. No dues shall be assessed against such Honorary Members. Honorary Members are privileged to take part in all social activities of the Council but shall not be eligible to vote or hold regular office in the Council.

**Associate Member** – Non- citizens may be Associate Members provided that they are proposed by a Council and not by an individual. An Associate Member shall be entitled to vote and hold office at the Council level, with the exception of serving as Council President. Current annual dues structure applies.

**Guest Member** – National Members who are not dues paying Local Members shall be designated as Guest Members. These members will receive invitations to local events but charged a higher cost than Regular Members. Guest Members shall also be eligible to receive the Bullhorn Newsletter via e-mail.

**Spouse of Active Duty Personnel** – Active Duty Spouses are eligible for either a FREE E-membership or a regular membership at a reduced rate; however, they may neither vote nor hold office. The offer of a free E-membership has been extended from 2020 until the end of 2021.

Community Affiliate Membership – Community Affiliate Membership is designed for companies whose business is primarily local rather than national in orientation, whose primary interest is in the activities and concerns of the local Council and desire to support and advance the mission and objectives of the Navy League. During each year of membership, a Community Affiliate Member may designate up to four (4) Regular Members, provided such Members are otherwise qualified. Designated members enjoy all the privileges of individual Membership including the right to vote and hold office.

**Members in Good Standing** - Members whose dues are current shall be considered Members in Good Standing, and shall have all resulting rights and privileges of membership including the right to vote and to serve as Council Officers and /or on the Council Board of Directors.

**General** - Each applicant for membership shall be presented to the Board of Directors for approval. Upon approval, the Executive Secretary will provide the National Headquarters with appropriate documentation and national dues, if appropriate


